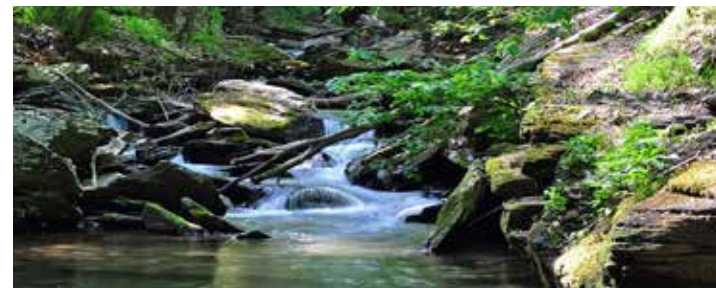

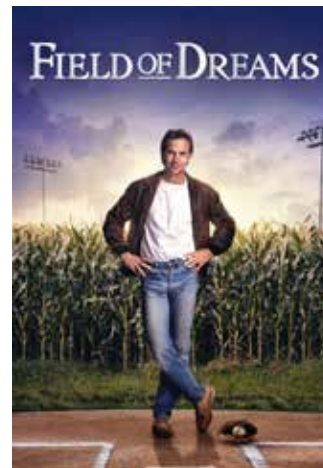

**JACKIE BRENDEL**, Director of Environmental Services, manages the MMC Transportation Department. She has been with Moravian Manor Communities for 19 years, and also manages the Housekeeping and Laundry Departments.

**MARIAN FERTENBAUGH** is the Team Leader and has been with MMC for 9 years. Prior to joining the Transportation Team, Marian was a CNA in skilled nursing.

**AMY WINGENROTH**, who you may recognize from your trips to the salon, is the newest Transportation team member. Amy has been with MMC for 20 years, and until recently worked in both the Beauty Shop and Transportation department. As of May 1, Amy is now with the Transportation team fulltime.

### *Fun Fact: Our two transportation drivers completed over 1,400 transports in 2023!*

Transportation services have evolved over time as our community has grown, so we would like to take this opportunity to clarify the services that we currently offer.

- At this time the Transportation Departments has 4 vehicles to utilize:
  - Dodge Wheelchair Van
  - Toyota Scion Passenger Vehicle
  - Toyota Avalon Passenger Vehicle
  - 14 Passenger Wheelchair Bus
- Transportation services are offered to all MMC residents, at all levels of care, for medical appointments, personal trips, and shuttles.
- Transportation is offered between the hours of 7:30 am – 4 pm, Monday through Friday. Arrangements outside of these times may be made based upon staff availability for appointments or events at an additional fee.
- MMC offers free shuttle services campus-to-campus for events and activities, visiting with friends or family members, physical therapy services, and salon appointments. To ensure availability, please make arrangements as soon as the need is known. Shuttle services may be provided by authorized drivers in departments other than the Transportation Department.

# Meet the Transportation Team!

- A transportation aide is available to make arrangements for your transportation to medical appointments. To ensure availability, it is recommended that you contact the transportation office prior to scheduling your appointment. If the appointment has already been scheduled, the transportation aide is still able to assist you with transportation subject to availability.
- Transportation should be arranged at least 48 hours in advance. Providing even more notice will increase the likelihood of transportation availability. We recommend that you reach out to the Transportation Office as soon as a need is known.
- A few other items to note: We do not provide drivers for personal vehicles. We reserve the right to cancel prearranged transportation services due to inclement weather. The driver can wait no longer than 10 minutes past the arranged pick up time. If making an appointment for an outpatient surgery, we recommend that a family member or POA accompany you to the appointment. If this is not possible, then the driver may stay at the appointment with you, however, these arrangements must be made in advance and based upon availability. The companion fee will be charged for the amount of time that the transportation team member is attending the appointment.
- Pricing for medical appointments is by zone:
  - Zone 1: 0-5 miles round trip- \$20
  - Zone 2: 6-15 miles round trip- \$30
  - Zone 3: 16-25 miles round trip- \$44

*\*each mile over 25 miles round trip will be charged at \$1.50 per mile*
- Pricing for non-medical transport:
  - 0-5 miles round trip- \$10
  - 6-15 miles round trip- \$20 plus \$1/mile
- If a companion is needed for either a medical or non-medical trip, or the driver is required to wait, the companion fee will be applied. This fee is charged in 15-minute increments and is \$45/hr.
 

*\*non-medical trips may be transported by authorized drivers in departments other than the Transportation Department*
- Any trips cancelled with less than 24-hour notice will have a cancellation fee of \$25 applied.
