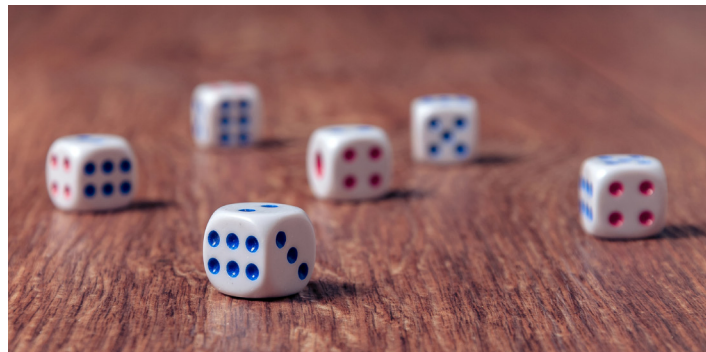
DIY Card Making and Scrapbooking Class WEDNESDAY, APRIL 1, 2:00 PM, GATHERING PLACE
