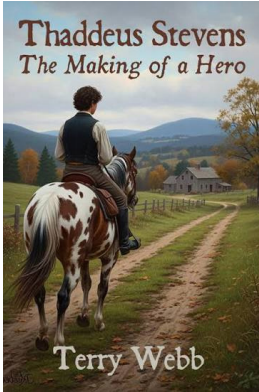

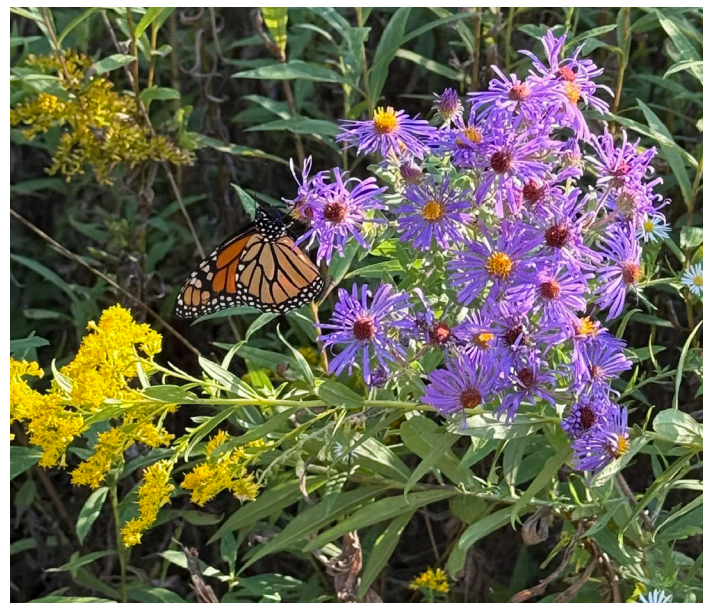

Lamplighters 250th Anniversary Quilt Auction to Benefit MMC's Benevolent Care Fund



Through a special upcoming Lamplighter auction, residents and friends of the MMC community will have the opportunity to own a one-of-a-kind commemorative quilt while supporting the Benevolent Care Fund.

The featured item is a beautiful handcrafted quilt celebrating the 250th anniversary of the birth of the United States.

The quilt was created and generously donated by Linda Matthews, a resident of The Woods, whose lifelong passion for quilting began with a Bicentennial auction many years ago. Linda has been quilting ever since. She is an active member of the Red Rose Quilting Guild and enjoys quilting with her church group, the MMC Quilters, and MCC Quilters, and on her own. In addition to selling her quilts, she frequently donates her handcrafted creations to charitable organizations.

This striking 52-inch by 44-inch quilt is made from 100% cotton panel with a pieced border and features a patriotic design including feathers that beautifully complement the eagle's wings, as well as a hand-stitched binding. Its craftsmanship and historical theme make it a unique piece that can be displayed as a wall hanging, used as a decorative throw, or presented as a special gift.

The quilt has been professionally appraised between \$150 and \$200, and will be displayed at Founders Campus and The Woods.

To enter the bidding, community members and friends can complete a bid ticket with their desired bid amount and submit it for a chance to win this beautiful quilt. All proceeds will benefit MMC's Benevolent Care Fund.
