### Resident Awardee - Joe Sullivan

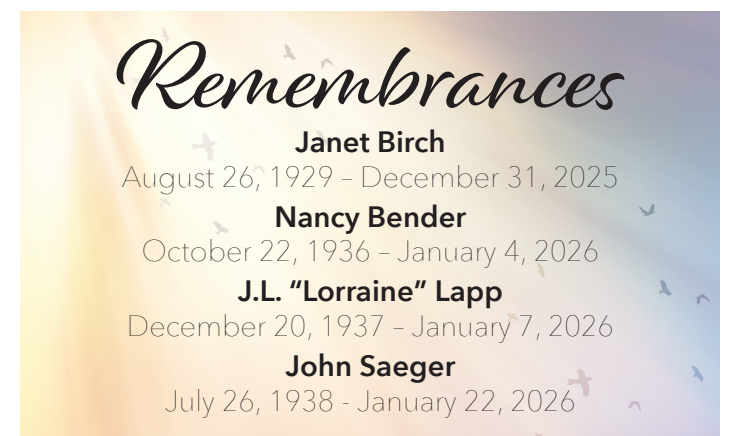

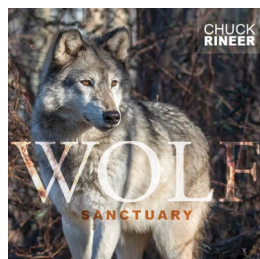
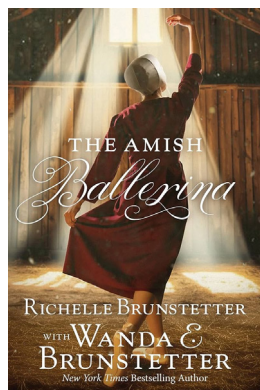
## Library CORNER

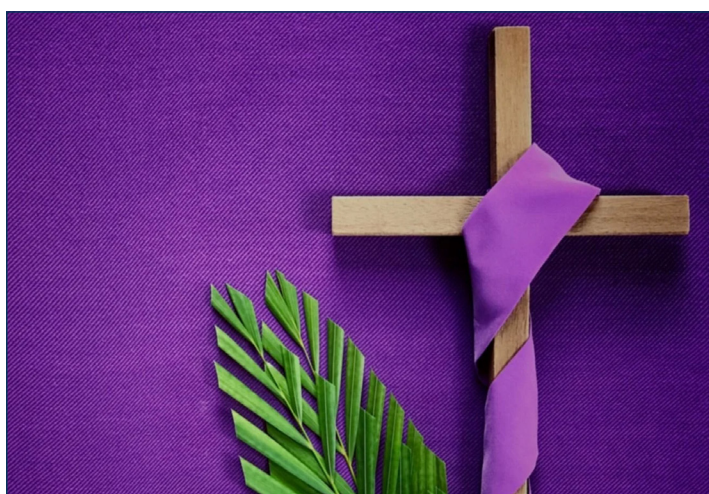
