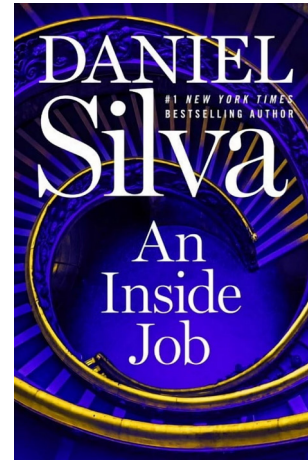
May's Library display table will showcase Women Authors and subjects.
